INTRODUCTION

First of all I want to point out, that German is my mother language and not English. Therefore, please don't be too hard with your judgement with my English. – I tried my best to make a good translation of my book Hollywood *stories:* JESUS II., which I wrote in year 2001 as a limited edition of 100 issues as a PRESS RELEASE and which was printed in a limited edition of 1.000 issues as a COLLECTORS ITEM in year 2009. This book is sold at the Gallery Udo Schmidt, who is representing myself as a sales point for my oil paintings and... books (in this special case) in DE- 58507 Luedenscheid (Germany) Altenaer Street 34.

- 0. Concerning the content of this book: This book tells you the almost adventurous story of a screenplay called ROCKY VI LADIES FIRST (ROY SAVIOUR), which I wrote for Hollywood. Its presentation at FRANCHISE PICTURES and Elie Samaha, the producer of Sylvester Stallone, Bruce Willis and John Travolta at the Sunset Boulevard of Hollywood. And how the screenplay itself has been sold to Cassian Elwes, one of the top agents of the enormously important WILLIAM MORRIS AGENCY in Beverly Hills at 08th February 2000.
- 1. But it contains itself the screenplay as well. Actually it's a book of dialogues with short instructions for the filmmakers. The original screenplay script, from which the actor Clark Gable learned his lines for the film GONE WITH THE WIND, has been sold many years ago for 200.000 US-dollars. Who knows, how valuable this book will be one day, which you are holding in your hands? Is it true that it contains the history of Jesus II. ?
- 2. Concerning the subject: As a true fanatic I watched my very first Formula One race in TV in year 1961. Stirling Moss won it in his Lotus 18. Today he's called *Sir* Stirling Moss. Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth II. entitled him some years ago. This fact alone enlightens the important position of motor racing for a land, a country, the industry and most of all: for their people.
- 3. After having translated together with my love Uscha Turat between the years 1979 and 1981 at Paris-France 42 issues of the Formula One magazine GRAND PRIX INTERNATIONAL into German language, I wrote as a co author in 1983 the book FERRARI FASCINATION ON WHEELS for Helmut "AUTO" Becker, a car dealer at Düsseldorf-Germany. In this work is printed an interview with the living legend Enzo Anselmo Ferrari founder of SEFAC Ferrari automobiles for which I needed more than eight years to get it. But thanks to Carolina Nuvolari, Brenda Vernor, Dr. Ennio Mortara and Roberto Nosetto they mostly cooperated very well with the old

and wise magician at Maranello-Italy, all went well in year 1978 and changed my life completely.

- 4. In year 1998 I observed a picture of the Hollywood Superstar Sylvester Stallone in the race magazine MOTORSPORT aktuell, who visited the paddock of Italian Gran Premio della Formula Uno at Monza racetrack. In those days I thought that celebrities and glamorous people from Hollywood are belonging to Formula One stylish grounds... At the beginning of 1999 I read something about a Formula One film, which Stallone wanted to make. "Wonderful!" I thought. After the seven films about motor racing I knew quite well, I was awaiting a true action blockbuster of this very successful actor, who called himself ROCKY BALBOA and RAMBO in some serial productions and who is a multi million dollars heavy immigrant from the New York Bronx with the gigantic American dream factory of film in his back.

- 5. Shortly after that I read in the news about script problems between Formula One boss Mr. Bernie Ecclestone and Sylvester Stallone, who wanted not only to play the main role, but representing the film director and screenplay writer as well. Allegedly Stallone intended to let the racing drivers making a box fight against each other in the pit lane. (I don't know whether this is true. But Stallone and Hollywood itself wanted their own actors and race winners and had their own ideas about the money printing machine called *Merchandising*.)
- 6. "This is good for myself!" I thought, when I've read about these problems. Because "You have enough experience about Formula One. You have published enough articles and you have an English certificate from Cambridge University (education via a school centre at Paderborn and branch Cologne). And you have promised years ago to write a screenplay to Yolanda Egger, the wife of Marc Surer, European Formula Two Champion on a March-BMW. Marc is an Ex-Formula One driver and F1-commentator today..." Yolanda herself is not only a very pretty woman, but speaks five languages and has done a Diploma as an actress. She had a role for instance in the serial production for German second TV station (ZDF in Mainz) called DREAMSHIP. More than that, she was the successful "Playmate of the year 1984" of the German issued PLAYBOY magazine.
- 7. In spring 1999 I sat down at my computer and wrote without having a contract my own Formula One screenplay. Every day one yellow page in average. Yellow coloured, because my teacher, the very successful writer Joseph Wechsberg (he wrote more then 30 books, which had been translated in 16 languages) worked as a Hollywood screenplay writer for the PARAMOUNT studios and lived in Beverly Hills. He was instructed in those days to write his own characters on yellow paper, because then his script was better to be read. But why did I wrote one page per day only? Because I had some other work to do to earn my living and more than that, it's not too easy to write good dialogues. They must be fine tuned, having an internal harmony, emanating a good rhythm, being well balanced, fresh and cheeky, courageously, but finely webbed, funny (if possible) and unexpectedly written. The writing should be breaking with some clichés. But it had to be one thing overall: a credible story!!!

Chapter 4: Rocky Stallone always arrives with the best and most spectacular women on stage, wherever these stages may be. That is his way of presenting Hollywood glamour. At Monza racetrack in Italy in year 1998 this woman wasn't the Danish Brigitte Nielsen anymore, but she presented herself still in perfect shape during a very hard action game in a jungle event camp filmed by RTL-TV.

- 8. Joseph 'Joe' Wechsberg was the most important partner in life of my Godmother and highly evaluated aunt Inez Kriso. With both I really liked to talk for many hours, days and months during my study life at Vienna-Austria (University for World Trade), but 'Joe' taught me more then only once the most important rule for a writer: "Life is writing the best stories!"
- 9. This was literally my guiding line. In other words: My screenplay, which was presented by myself at FRANCHISE PICTURES at Hollywood for Claudia Schiffer, Yolanda Egger and Sylvester Stallone and sold the very same day to the WILLIAM MORRIS AGENCY at Beverly Hills-Los Angeles USA under the working title ROCKY 6 –LADIES FIRST (ROY SAVIOUR) is based on many true stories of my personal life.
- 10. Of course I tried to make some details more fitting for film making process. Some scenes are even freely invented by myself. But the most important actions and short stories really took place in that or a quite similar way in true life. I must admit anyway, that some good stories, ideas, thoughts and/or talks with my friends have been used as good material, which maybe would never ever had a chance to be seen on cinema screens, TV sets nor in Internet neither being printed between the covers of a book or a magazine.
- 11. Well then, and maybe now you will ask yourself what does this all will have in common with the possible film title BEN HUR II or the book title JESUS II.?! Does JESUS II. really want to drive a Formula One race? Please start reading, be amazed, enjoy it, start laughing or even crying, do what you like as an adequate action, when you read how his life took place or should have been or will be in the upcoming future. All this could have taken place or will happen (maybe) somehow. GOD knows it, I don't know it yet...
- 12. Therefore I do thank all the people, whom I directly know (*personally*) or indirectly (*by TV*, *cinema or media*), who gave me the courage to write this book, for enriching your own personal life as a reader by all the wisdoms and experiences won by all of us, hopefully anyhow, it will enrich your life.
- 13. I want to express my special THANKS to three dead and three living persons: Charles Spencer Chaplin, the great actor, whom the world knows by his cinema name Charlie 'THE TRAMP'. His film THE KID has been the very first film, which I have seen in cinema. An important film, because it showed to myself, that I have to stand behind my dreams and that I should try to realize them. Even if it's "only" on screen in a cinema. If oneself is loosing his illusions, oneself is actually stopping his own life. Therefore some 60 year old people simply died at the age of thirty something...
- 14. My THANKS are valid as well for the painting genius of a Pablo Picasso and Leonardo da Vinci. They have realized their deeply felt ideas and wishes with the help of colour, canvas, brush, red pencil and parchment... Shining examples!
- 15. In general, somebody who really gave me the courage to write a book or better said a screenplay was Bob Lutz. Until the merger between Daimler-Benz and Chrysler he was the Vice President of this third biggest car giant in the USA. In year 1998 he published

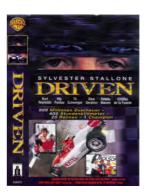
the absolute fantastic book called GUTS. In German language this means to have the courage (or forces of the vertebra), how to impress the makers all over the world: By thinking and rethinking three times about the best possible actions which have to take place and then DO IT, if you are able to think and... to do... - And he is able to do this, the Ex-marine and fighting jet pilot, who likes to call his father, who is more then ninety years old, COACH (teacher), nevertheless the fact that Bob Lutz has been in top level professional positions at Opel, BMW and Ford in Germany. Therefore I say 'Thank you that you have written and published the book GUTS. And thank you that you have answered my letter, Mister Bob!!!'

- 16. And I want to thank my parents, too: Ingrid Anna Irmgard Marie born Doering and my father Dr. Karl-Alfred Klutmann. They have had the courage shortly after the human beings ignoring horror of World War II to give me life and the chance to live it according to my own wishes and ideas.
- 17. This book, dear reader, wants to give you the courage to fulfil your own wishes, dreams and... to stand behind your longings to make them come true. Realize yourself!!! Maybe by observing targets or aims, which seem absolutely outside of your own possibilities. Seeming not to be able to be fulfilled. But maybe, you can realize them as well... against all odds, so-too-speak.
- 18. By the way, my subject is the film CHAMPS (called according to the CHAMPION-SHIP CAR series in US-motor racing, done by US-top actor Sylvester Stallone. And CHAMPS has been the working title for his planned Formula One film. Later it has been renamed into DRIVEN. How many of my experiences or ideas of myself the team around Sylvester Stallone has used from my screenplay I can't judge in the moment, because the film isn't yet in the cinemas during my writing of these lines. (This means the German edition, which has been published a couple of days before the official presentation of the Sylvester Stallone film DRIVEN in the cinemas, 27th April 2001). Anyhow, Stallone has been quoted by the magazine AMICA, when he expressed his feelings about... "a red carpet during writing the word END at the end of my own screenplay script." That's exactly the way how my screenplay ends, too. About rebirth Stallone is talking in AMICA as well. And this is also the subject of my screenplay and this book, apart from some other revolutionary and evolutionary ideas of myself.
- 19. My screenplay has been presented and registered at attorneys with the date 03rd February 2000 to get save copyright protection under the existing law. But will I see myself in court with some big Hollywood producers to get my rights? I do not hope so...
- 20. But this is for sure: German actors Verona Feldbusch and Til Schweiger took part both in the Stallone film DRIVEN. I keep my fingers crossed that this film will become a good film, which therefore will be successfully presented and hopefully will play a tremendous story in film history. Will DRIVEN have the potential to get an OSCAR? Why not? A film, which has exactly this name has been done by Sylvester Stallone as well. Maybe he will make it again with DRIVEN at the next Academy Award celebration under the title BEN HUR II.
- 21. Another thing is for sure as well. (WALT) DISNEY PICTURES has taken 31 of

my ideas from my screenplay ROCKY VI – LADIES FIRST (ROY SAVIOUR) for the Bruce Willis film THE KID. (It was presented successfully in the cinemas of year 2000). – By the way, before my screenplay has landed in Hollywood, Bruce Willis just had finished a tremendous crime comedy called THE WHOLE NINE YARDS, produced by FRANCHISE PICTURES, a company which had produced the film BATTLEFIELD EARTH, a film with John Travolta as well. A flop at the box offices of the film cinemas, as I've been told. Maybe because the Scientology founder Ron Hubbard has written the screenplay??? I don't know, I have neither seen nor written this screenplay. More than that, it seems to be a quite destroying movie picture.

- 22. However I've seen the extremely beautiful old building of this sect, religious group, economical power or whatever it may be, at Los Angeles, from the outside. After the reading of DIANETIK, their bible some 20 years ago, and a lot of critical newspaper reports I really don't know, whether I should have a voluntary look to the inside of this power house!!! (Today I see things under a different angle, but these were my words in year 2001)...
- 23. Here are some Hollywood-films of the years 2000 and 2001, which seemed to me quite important to note or interesting to watch even:

Hopefully my bank account will remark this as well and will be delighted about it... because I took quite interested notice about the German film DAS EXPERIMENT about a very shocking project of the Stanford University and a film series in five parts called AN IMPOSSIBLE MAN... However I was surprised about some very successful advertising campaigns. For instance for AUDI cars with a flexible Elvis Presley puppet hanging at the interior rear mirror of the car, a TV clip with a baby for a bank, Madonna's Video-Clip with a bull riding machine. – And of course, I didn't miss the TV-adverts with Claudia Schiffer for coffee and *dessous*-underwear (in Lausanne newspaper), but they weren't really based on my screenplay, which I had sold at Beverly Hills, that's for sure. Because this part I didn't hand over in L.A.... What a pity, bad luck? – But how did this part of the advertising film industry got notice from my work? At least the second part of my screenplay.

- 27. Well, you know, that's the way it really took place at the 08th February 2000 at

We crossed England and Greenland to make our way towards Canada, via the Big American Seas, crossed *gambletown* Las Vegas a true light jewel by night and uncounted motorcar *freeways*, to be thrown into the business pleasure at LAX: the so called palm tree flanked Los Angeles Tom Bradley International Airport.

- 30. In front of maybe 20 booking desks you are waiting in a giant 'human snake' for the import of your own EGO into the United States of America. Your view is fixed onto the magic yellow line, which you are allowed to cross by instruction of the immigration officer. After this permission he asked me to wait and instructed me that I had to be so kind to instruct a couple of pensioners, who seem to be a little bit confused about the way to make their toll declaration before they would be allowed to cross the yellow line, as well.
- 31. Yourself, you are finally allowed to immigrate into the promised land after having declared according to the truth that you are absolutely not a disturbing factor, that you don't intend to offer drugs, but you intend to sell a screenplay for instance, this means business. No holiday, five days of top action, weekend inclusive. You have no intention to

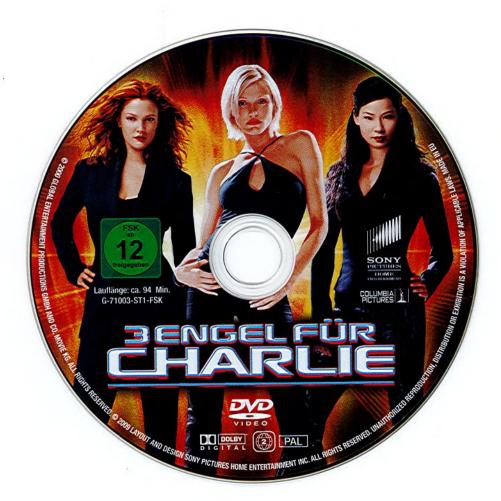
stay longer then three months without permission (Visa), if nothing unpleasant would have interfered... (And there was quite something which interfered). But as a quite well trained middle European foreigner you have taken this into account of your travel planning...

- 32. Well then. After the baggage claim and the toll-procedure you are standing in front of nearly ten telephones and you have to decide yourself for the right Car Rental Company. I tried AVIS and HERTZ only to be informed that a green NATIONAL bus would stop soon in front of the genius Spider building outside of the Terminal, which would bring me to the Rental Car Area. And that's exactly what the bus did.
- 33. There I was very welcomed by the *Black Beauty Tequita* with her brightly shining ultra white teeth and the *Hispano Miguel* at the heartiest. I didn't really know that both of them had waited so eagerly on my arrival. Anyway I got the impression to be the most important customer on Mother Earth. Of course, every NATIONAL customer gets this impression, but that's another story...
- 34. As an economical security for assurance of the rented car I paid 600 US-dollars, which I would get back after having driven and given back the car without being involved in any accident or something like that. And my personal passport and other papers had to be photocopied by them. No problem, the Originals would stay with me. Now it was my turn to choose the best suiting car of their rental car park. I liked them all! Because there was parking... one car only.
- 35. A red Cavalier of Chevrolet. I must admit it was not a flaming red Corvette. But this machine is allocated on a much higher category on the so called Richter fun scale of the sports car myths, which is open on an up-up-and-away basis, if you know what I mean. The Cavalier shocked myself with its instruction manual, thick like a book, and after quite a while of intensive research I was really not able to switch off the lights. The car lights in the front. I believed that this had been planned by the Car Rental Company. Due to safety reasons. Because then you are better seen by other drivers or pedestrians in road traffic. And when you are making something really wrong or completely wrong as well on the streets of L.A., on which something like 12 million people try to find their ways through their hopefully interesting lives.
- 36. The Cavalier convinced myself by a strong bass of its Stereo-Radio and the simply smooth operating automatic transmission gearbox. On the other hand the drivers seat was a bit too soft for my tormented back. But that was it... I cruised with a comfortable sound volume of the Radio through Southern California and tried to sing the texts, if I knew them during the time the Radio was reproducing them *online*.
- 37. The car was looking firmly after the way to the coast. And found it finally. There I really took a deep breath of my eyes being impressed by the view by hundreds of very pretty, slim, high or also small, but green and majestic palm trees which were waving themselves under the warming sun at the busy water waves of the Pacific Ocean strand.
- 38. After I got stuck in the only dead end road of the *Marina del Rey* district, I found the emergency exit after I had done a hearty U-turn supported by the handbrake, some-

thing like a controlled 180 degrees turn and drove again to the palm tree Ocean Boulevard. I passed the well known Hotel California (What a really good song this was more then twenty years ago... and still is, even today!!!) Before I reached Santa Monica, I had chosen the Strand Boulevard again, to let the Cavalier cruise to the direction of Malibu Beach.

- 39. After many miles along the Pacific Ocean the Cavalier switched into a lower gear to climb up the steep hill street from strand into the direction of Los Angeles City: the quite wide Sunset Boulevard, which is winding like a snake on top of the hills... which reminded me of course to the TV-production *Seventy Seven Sunset Strip* done with the famous actor Cookie. Oh, lovely old Black-and-White TV-times... even the good old flickering box in our homes brought Hollywood flair into the cosy rooms of our busy working parents who tried to recover from the aftermaths of stupid World War II....
- 40. Here the houses had high numbers, around the 13.000. I had to drift forward into the lower numbers of the 8.000s. Exactly here is residing the Multi billion US-Dollar tycoon *Sir* Richard Branson with his Virgin Record Stores. Shortly before this number my US-contact person was working: Elie Samaha. The producer... well, yes... of: Sylvester Stallone.
- 41. For this Superstar and top money maker of the Hollywood film industry, who made a fortune by his ROCKY- and RAMBO film sagas I had written my screenplay in nearly a one year long day- and night shift. For the female main roles I had integrated Claudia Schiffer, a German Supermodel of the catwalk, who was interested to make a career in film business and my Swiss friend Yolanda Egger. She had driven some races for the Bavarian Motor Works (BMW-car company) with an official entered touring car. Furthermore she was German edition PLAYBOY *Playmate of the year 1984* and... she is a five language speaking actress with an actor-Diploma. Early in year 1988 she asked myself, whether I could write her a screenplay... In those days I did not succeed... Unfortunately...
- 42. My script today calls ROCKY 6 LADIES FIRST. But it has apart from two scenes really nothing to do with boxing. At $03^{\rm rd}$ February 2000 I let the screenplay be officially registered by a big attorney office, to protect my international copyright. And save copyrights are really worth a lot. In year 1996 around four million US-dollars had been paid for a script, which was very much in demand. In year 2000 the Indian writer Night Y. Shyamahan got five million US-dollars for his exciting script UNBREAK-ABLE, with actor Bruce Willis in the main role, just a couple of years after they had done a blockbuster at the cinema box offices and in video shops as well, THE SIXTH SENSE.
- 43. Believe it or not, Elie Samaha had not only Sylvester Stallone under contract, but Bruce Willis and John Travolta, too. Whether he was or even is working for Arnold Schwarzenegger as well, is not to my knowledge. Anyway, Willis, Schwarzenegger and Stallone have been partners for the Planet Hollywood Restaurant chain PR-Management...
- 44. Well, you know, I did not know anything about this in those moments neither...

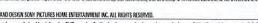
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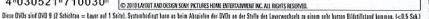

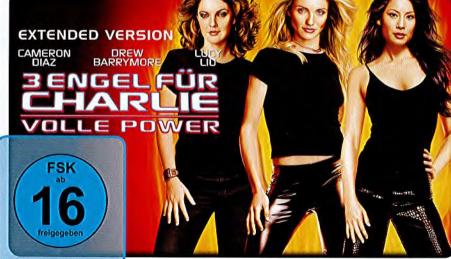

Please remind yourself: Boring building units in uniformity style are really not the American Way of luxury Life. Motto: "I am who I am and please, very much different from all the others!"

- 45. Completely different is the *VIPER* room Club at the Sunset Boulevard as well. Totally black painted... Shocking... I passed it quite impressed and astonished like I had been about the fashionable Beverly Hills. I nearly dislocated my neck in front of the Wilshire Hotel and I liked the view onto the Sunset Plaza Hotel. To be quite amused about the way the name of the next Hotel or newspaper (?) was allocated: upside down: STANDARD... I observed with never ending passion and astonishment numberless film- and advertising placard boards on, at and beside buildings at the boulevard (MISSION TO MARS, for instance) only to be completely convinced: You are just in the center of American film industry.
- 46. And here we are: Down under a well tanned, brown burned hyper slim, long leg, bathing cloth fashion Top Model on a XXXL-advertising placard was allocated the aim of my journey. The residence of Elie Samaha: FRANCHISE PICTURES...
- 47. To tell you the truth, I was a bit surprised. I expected a little bit more like bigger, higher, faster, better, fresher and newer. More American so-too-speak. Instead it was a white quadratic *Oldtimer* building with a quite small main entrance. But it was allocated just between two top super pubs. An Irish Whiskey Bar and a cosy Coffee Shop with big open air terraces and a jewel of a small garden in front of the entrance door. The interior was dominated by a huge chimney in the style of an old Canadian lumberjack house.
- 48. Well then, now I knew where I had to drive on Monday. If you know your target you have paid half of your rent per month, so-too-speak. Who has to make a full research to navigate to his driving destiny gets really negative stress, especially standing in a traffic jam, and that's exactly what I hate on a *Monday*, *Monday*... (what a superb "Mama's and the Papa's" song of the Golden Sixties!) When I wanted to be precisely in a business meeting at eight o'clock in the morning, I had to leave my overnight accommodation at half past six at the latest, in my case the huge Ocean Luxury Liner Queen Mary, fixed on a chain in the harbour of Long Beach. Some time I arrived at the 101 Freeway, took later the 405 Highway and the 710 Interstate, I think. Anyhow, whatever their names, the figures are correct. Over there was waiting the super ship laying on a chain after the crossing of two skyscraper high steel rip monsters of a bridge, safely in the harbour of Long Beach. Waiting for the arrival of the tired knight from Good Old Germany. Exactly here, at the steel bridges were chosen the locations for some shots of the film generation 2000 for CHARLIES ANGELS (the US-racing car is driven by the actress Cameron Diaz) and 60 SECONDS ONLY (in this film Nicolas Cage is flying with a brutal Ford Shelby

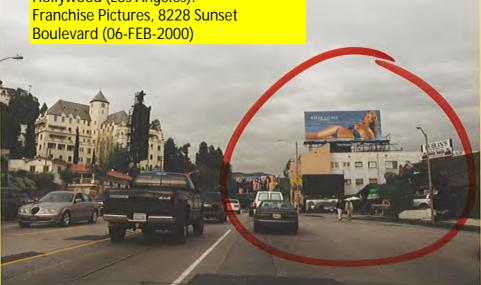

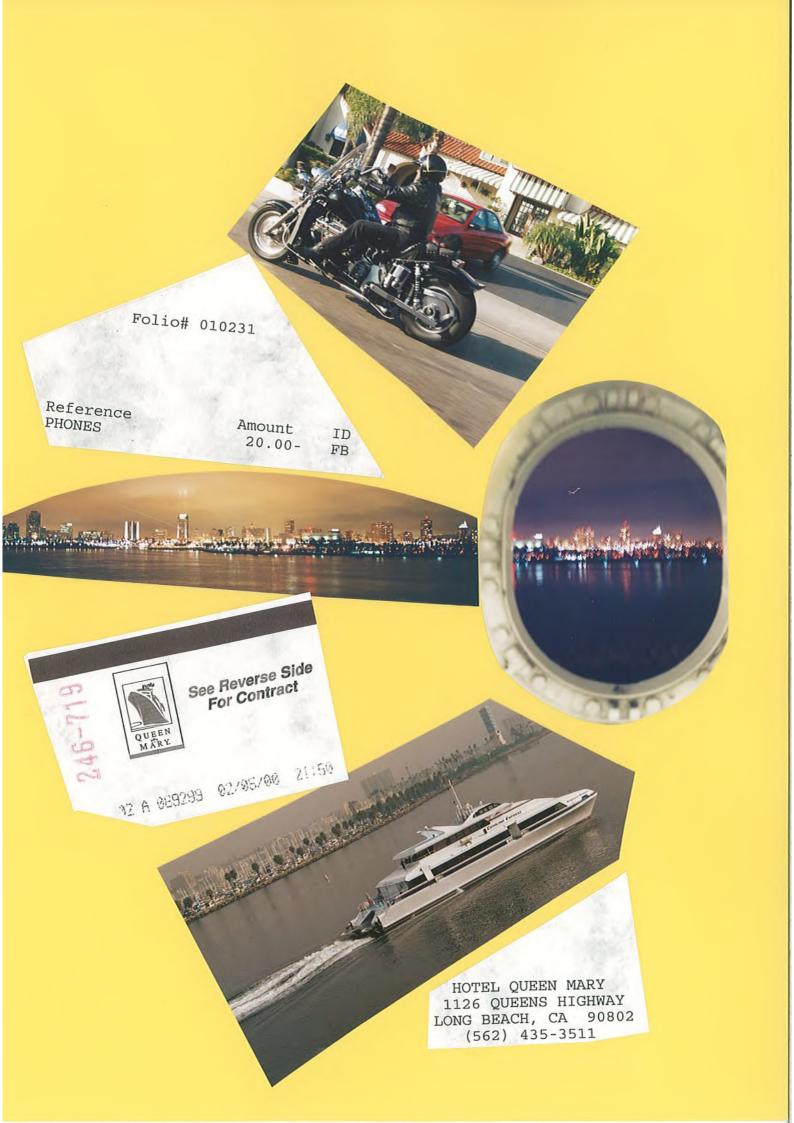

- 500 GT Mustang across a waiting traffic jam of cars), now these locations just close to the harbour are a pilgrim destiny of the inspired cineastes.
- 50. The red Cavalier was waiting at the *Parking Volet* beside the swimming giant of the ocean and I accepted the lifting of my three aluminium suitcases by the porter into the third floor (by elevator of course!). There I was welcomed quite friendly at the reception, but was informed too, that my name was not booked. "Your name is not possible to be found in the computer." Naturally this information was not really to my liking, because I did not only book my stay on the Queen Mary ten days in advance, but I had PAID for it three nights in advance as well!!!
- 51. But my written papers did not impress the officer in the front desk, called Cesar, really much. Obviously he knew the Shania Twain song ("That don't impress me much") and strictly observed the lines as well. And this time it was to my regret. After maybe ten minutes of talking and rethinking I did sent Cesar politely to his central computer allocated in the rear teak wood galleys of the Queen Mary by telling him, that I was booked in advance more often under this or that, completely different or risky names. Cesar disappeared and did not come back for something like a twenty minutes while. Now I was able to get an impression by a lot of Kids wearing baseball caps, fashionable oversized trousers and coloured T-shirts, who obviously had booked in a correct way. Anyway, Cesar came back by secret information, how it seemed from his central computer, because he had found all in a sudden my name. Surprise, surprise, written with the character "G". (He wanted to get some nice, fresh unwritten postcards from *Good Old Germany...* which he received, I hope, because I had send them to him shortly afterwards being back in Europe again, actually they were from Spain, the place where I love to live more often today or in the upcoming future).
- 54. The cabin A 031 is maybe three to four meters square big. The Queen sized bed is fitting well to the name of the Hotel. The bath tube is remarkably deep, the armatures were breathing the look of *Anno Domini 1930* (the date was written on top of them...) and the fat chairs invited myself for a relaxed creative recreation pause for thinking over the next actions which had to be taken by myself. Everywhere were laying well

- 55. The view through the oval-vertical porthole was a masterpiece of an impressive view onto the mariner-harbour and the downtown-city of Long Beach. Here two decades ago took place the USA-Grand Prix of Formula One, in which the until then called 'Indestructable' Swiss Ensign pilot Clay Regazzoni found himself in hospital after crashing heavily into a wall due to a defect braking pedal. After that I had the approaching of a more heavily feeling of hunger and chose quite elegant clothes for dinner. Dress rehearsal. The light glasses of my Porsche goggles were replaced against a pair of blue ones. I laid my worthy chain requisite of golden coins around my neck for getting the feeling of the *Prince Valiant film* I wanted to play in. Then I slipped into the right T-Shirt, Jacket on top and now I felt quite comfortably equipped against any attack of my professional actions. The improvised armour of a knight fitted like having come out of a casting foundry...
- 57. Only the tie I could have left out, because I was the only person with a rope around my neck. Anyway, the main thing was that I felt okay. And I felt very okay, so-too-speak. The world experienced atmosphere of the steamboat (1.001 crossing of the Atlantic ocean according to the instruction manual, which I bought in the souvenir shop) was colouring completely onto my rational and irrational thoughts. No negative emotion was able to stop myself anymore. Why should they? The maybe most important 120 hours of my lifetime until then stood on top of my agenda! I staid quite cool and had a feeling of a self observing control unit in a height of maybe three meters above myself which judged me with the motivating essence "...you will make it!!! Because you have worked extremely consequently within the last eleven month. If you don't make it, who else will do it then?"
- 58. Then I got nagging doubts on my costume of nerves again. "Others are very well as well. Everybody is starting in a small order, but you yourself are starting at Hollywood. Are you really starting to try making business with the top stars? Megalomaniac?" Then again: "No, not at all. The nearly 100 true short stories about your life between 1950 and year 2000 followed by some *fictions* until year 2016 are simply too interesting, funny, sad, exciting and entertaining."
- 59. More then that: "You are going into cinemas since year 1956. You are knowing, which films you are liking. You are knowing, why the ROCKY saga has been a success. You have seen all the Stallone-films apart from CLIFFHANGER. And you are knowing, why the new STAR WARS episode had the huge turn around of 922 million US-dollars in year 1999 only. You have written and send a fax to the Stallone management









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called Brillstein-Grey Entertainment to inform them about the spectator target groups for your very own screenplay. After that you received an important answer at the very next day. By phone and written on a piece of paper. After an informative talk with precisely asked questions you received the important address of the producer Elie Samaha. This can only mean, that the descriptions in your fax can't be wrong... "Take care and you will make it!!!"

60. The salad, which I took in the ART DECO Salon of the Queen Mary was delicious. The waiter – Carlos from Mexico – presented himself in a typically friendly and politely Californian style. The pineapple- and orange juices very magnificent and a very good finish for a very healthy meal. Around ten p.m. I started my pilgrimage to my cabin and there I read something about L.A. and the possibilities of visiting museums. Shortly after that I slept in quickly to be fit again at the next morning around nine a.m. due to my Jetlag...

Visit of the Universal Studios

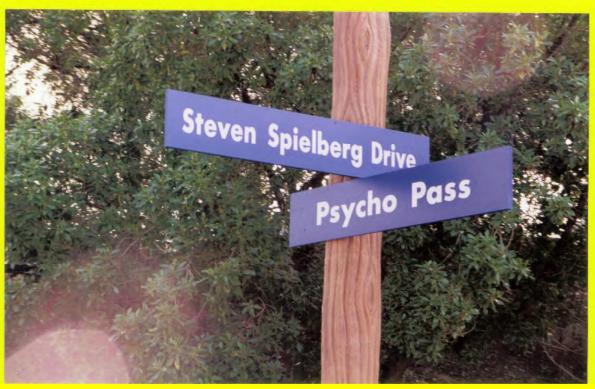
Sunday, 06th February 2000

- 61. At the breakfast room I was awaited by a surfer-Team from Hawaii. I had taken into account a lot of possibilities, but this one... I must admit, was not among them. Brian told me everything about the monster waves at his strand at Jaws-Hawaii, ten and more meters high and the fear of death of the surfers on their backs. But he remarked the nice shots of adrenaline as well. He seemed to tell me all he knew about the international surfer circus. Everything about the voyages he did, the nicest places of the world (if you love the Caribbean area, then you are right, too) his aims, what he was longing for and his experiences with women etc. pp. Brian smiled and laughed a lot. Together with his team mates. One of his buddies was an English camera man, who informed me about the problems of taking pictures by *helicopter* for the *flip*, the turn around of the monster waves: "Don't fly too close to the surfer, otherwise you will make him *crazy*... because he then will make mistakes! Don't fly too far away, because then you will not make good pictures over the long zoomed distance of your camera."
- 62. Brian's buddy even knew something about the king class in motor racing, the Formula One: "The ultimate sport on earth!" He came from Silverstone, the British motorsport Mekka, a quite character forming place of birth.
- 63. Their mate, the Canadian top surfer was a stunning guy, he expressed himself in such a perfect Munich dialect, that I thought that he came from 'Monaco di Bavaria' like the Italians say. But it wasn't like that. He was a true Canadian... A funny troop, I can tell you... They invited me to a festival. For the upcoming three days there took place a surfer competition sponsored by SWATCH on the quay wall besides the flank of the Queen Mary. Even at eleven p.m. during the night the sheers of the enthusiastic

spectators seemed to be louder then the music... *No risk, no fun...* Unfortunately my planned *photo session* didn't take place, I was in L.A. to make business.

- 64. What a funny, but good feeling it was, to try to realize your most advanced professional aims in such a huge melting pot of nationalities. Somehow, really good!!! Before this finally really took place I visited the Universal Studios on Saturday at the back of Hollywoodland beside the *One-O-One Freeway*.
- 66. In the next building they give you a little bit bumpy new feeling with a 180 degree BACK TO THE FUTURE car flying machine, based on a modified De Lorean sports car. Very good... This is the future of our mobility... The accompanied astonished persons were all Japanese people, who were delighted by my try of speaking some Japanese words like "O genki desu... stay healthy" or "Domo arigato gozaimazu... thanks a lot", for your friendly smiles and bowing. - And here we go again: A short roundtrip is taking place through the Universal film hangars with action crash scenes in L.A. subways, KING KONG, burning helicopters, overturning oil transport trucks and wagons of a subway-train which are folding themselves together like an accordion (this all looked really scaring and seemed to be used for a film like DIE HARD). - Outside under fresh air again: the WHITE SHARK is jumping out of a quiet and peaceful lake, crossing the entrance of the Amblin-Studios by Steven Spielberg (built on Universal land, and now we know how incredibly worthy he is for them!). We followed our path across the hydraulically wobbling bridge of year 1937 for the film TRAIN ROBBERY and went like Moses with the Israelites through the trembling waters of the Red Sea. Moses was very well played by Charlton Heston in the TEN COMMANDEMENTS, finally we were observing a rainy Mexican village through which a completely unexpected wave of water was running. Water, which will be recollected over and over again, without disappearing in the waterproof bottom of the location.
- 67. All this was followed by new MELROSE PLACE locations. Then we took notice of the very first road, which played a role in the very first Western in the history of cinema. JURASSIC PARK locations with "true flesh" made out of plastics, hanging on oversized Dino bones. New locations for the FLINSTONES and... the tremendous view E.T. has onto the Universal Studios, the first view which the well beloved Extra Terrestrial has onto our planet mother Earth. Followed by whole quarters of a town for scenes for the unforgotten film EARTHQUAKE with Charlton Heston again.

- 68. Then we were frightened by the Horror house of Alfred Hitchcock and Anthony Perkins, followed by new locations for a snowy White Christmas fairy tale with Jim Carrey. It went into the cinemas at the end of year 2000 like it was scheduled. A success at the box office with the title THE GRINCH. Yesterday night it received the OSCAR for the best Make-up (of main actor Jim Carrey)!!!
- 69. We were impressed by the volcano for the film DANTES PEAK, in which 'James Bond' Pierce Brosnan played a main role. Then we saw the *Monument Valley* on the biggest painted film placard of the world. A quite romantic background for scenes of a Western, only a couple of months ago to be seen in full and beautiful width in the film CHARLIES ANGELS. In all cases the Universal Studio train is crossing important buildings, which have played a more than less interesting role in film history...
- 70. I was astonished about the quite hilly landscape of the Studio area, through which the acting screenplay writer Albert Brooks had to suffer going by feet, for trying in vain to get a date for a business meeting with Steven Spielberg, this is part of his latest film called MUSE (together with Sharon Stone). A really very good film! Brooks who not only wrote the screenplay, said in well chosen words, which every film lover should write himself behind his ears: "I am author, film director and producer. But the writing is more than anything else the most satisfying, but the most difficult to realize as well... Apart from this, if I am blessed by a car tomorrow, nobody will ever be able to continue writing my most important ideas onto paper to bring the film to an end. But is the script written, it is completely unimportant, what will happen to myself!!! Everybody can fix the strings together for making the film. Without screenplay, anyway, there is really no chance to do this..."

71. "Well said!" roared the lion.

- 72. After the journey with the train on rubber wheels I really adored the extremely impressive panoramic view onto the San Fernando Valley during going down into the JURASSIC PARK with a nearly endless rolling stair. *Gorgeous!* The Dinos look like really living animals and are quite fun. At first... Later in the park they are bigger and more aggressive. Finally they are spraying yourself with some jets of water out of their mouths and now at the latest you are knowing why you had been advised at the entrance to buy a cheep plastic coat for protection.
- 73. At the real end of this terrific ghost train of JURRASIC PARK you are plunging down a waterfall of maybe 16 meters height together with your cabled car and some 20 enthusiastic loudly screaming tourists. And this takes place just a couple of seconds after you had started to believe that you had escaped the furious bite of the incredibly huge monster Dino called Tyrannosaurus Rex. It's really out of this world, what kind of unexpected ideas the Americans are really able to have, if they like...
- 74. BACKDRAFT, here you will be following the narration of stories about fire hazards and their protection or fighting against fires themselves. A hot spot, I can tell you. A highly dangerous location. You are thinking "...every second it might be possible that I will fly into the air, in 1.000 pieces..." Fortunately you will never do it. But you will fly

with a huge bike hanging on a cableway through the next building: E.T., the Extra Terrestrial is on the program. A journey will follow through a dreamy landscape of elfs filled with wonderful flowers in the most exciting colours and forms. Unfortunately enough I was so stupid to ask whether it was allowed to take pictures over here. Here it was really worthwhile to take them. Anyway, next time I will not ask again... Nowhere else I had asked, but why did I asked over here? All together I took home 24 photo films!!! The result of the matter of fact, that I didn't ask for any permission at the other locations.

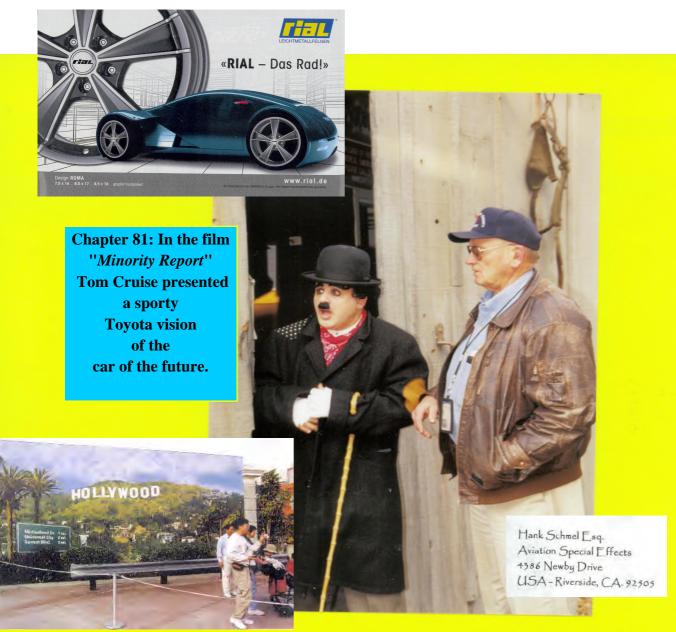
75. Just a moment, we are not all through it. In the *Wild West Show* I was waiting, together with the filling seats on the spectator grandstand, for the beginning of the *action stunt show*. Suddenly appeared Charlie Chaplin. The well beloved star of millions of cinemagoers and main character of my very first film in cinema: THE KID. Charlie entertains the audience with gags like this one: He is looking up into the air, as if there would be something worthwhile to be observed. The spectators are looking up into the air, as if there would be something worthwhile to be observed, but they keep going and... are running into each other. Followed by a big chaos...

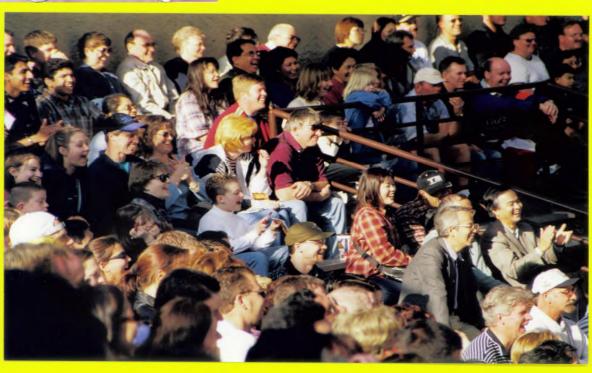
76. Or this one: Charlie is taking the hands of the husbands down from the hips or shoulders of their charming wives and puts his own hands onto the hips of the *Ladies*. He is marching step-by-step with the women. Until the lovely housewives had remarked that their men had gone into infidelity, some meters of distance had passed and the spectators are screaming, when Charlie is bowled, laughed at, scolded or even kissed by the *Ladies*.

77. Finally Charlie goes towards a couple from China. This has the intention to go to their seats on the right side of the stands. But Charlie invites them to go to the left side of the stands. The couple are obeying to his offer with some wise smiles and is looking for some good places on top of the rear left side of the stands. Charlie is grateful and makes some well behaved bows. The couple makes some well behaved bows in exchange, too. The spectators like this and clap their hands vividly. – Now Charlie is realizing again his celebration of laying down his hands onto the incoming Ladies. After five intermezzi Charlie reminds himself to the Chinese couple and bend his second finger to give them a hint to come to him again, if they like.

78. They like. Now Charlie is piloting them to the right side of the stands. There where they really liked to be just from the beginning. The couple express the enjoyment of the situation. The spectators are applauding and screaming. With some so easy *magic tricks* you would be able to bring young and elder people into a laughter. It would have been nice, if you had seen this, too...

79. The Western Stunt Show was a remarkable masterpiece of body control. Incredible what trained people are able to do, if they are really able to do it. To fall down with your astral body from a guessed six meter height of a Western house top roof onto seven pieces of loudly bursting wood laying well sorted on two racks only one meter above the ground without getting any harm or being blessed somehow, that's really something. Okay, there was an emergency exit with foamed plastic down under the racks, but the stuntman didn't need this life saving instrument...

- 80. Or what about this trick, to spring down into a deep fountain, being followed by an exploding bomb and even after this special treatment climbing back completely unhurt out of the fountain, that is really on the borderline to a wonder. Finally the hero is standing on a little space in front of the *Saloon*. Backwards. Then the front of the house is falling down all over him. And the hero will not be hit to death by it, but the house front has a window, exactly there, where the hero decided to stand... three words for this: Courage, *Timing*, Perfection.
- 81. I personally introduced myself to get knowledge to the *firecracker master of the universe*. Hank Small is his name. He is 60 years young and dynamic. Since 18 years he is reigning the *stunt shows* at Universal. In the Tom Cruise film TOP GUN he has had his magic explosive hands integrated in the game. Well then. Hank was quite pleasant and informative. He wanted to give me some addresses of producers. Because it would not be bad to have more then one iron in the hot spot Hollywood. On the other hand I was not 100 per cent sure, whether Elie Samaha was reminding himself on Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday to our telephone conversation and had remarked Monday as the date for our meeting, like he had confirmed on phone. (I wrote a letter to Hank, but until today 25th January 2010 I didn't receive an answer...)
- 82. When one of the WILD WEST show members of Hank came to our conversation and heard my ideas, he made a tired waving with his hands and meant that it was very easy to buy the producer addresses at the *bookshop* Samuel French at Beverly Hills. But he did not see any chance to make business with Sylvester Stallone, he meant. "For this you have to talk to 25 people in advance... and that is taking time, maybe a couple of some eternities." I answered that I already know the 25th person and would not give up before I really succeeded. With a tiring smile he let me alone with my ideas and intentions for making business with Hollywood...
- 83. Well, if you have to make seven *stunt show* performances per day, year by year, then it might be possible that you have different debit-credit experiences about your early illusions about the dream factory Hollywood and about their maybe uncommon but possible realization in the future, because you had planned them precisely in the past. I had much more luck then himself, I guessed. I did not know this. But I felt it somehow...
- 84. Nevertheless the fact that the complete film is not yet in the cinemas, but how said Albert Brooks in his own words: "...when the screenplay has been written, then it's only a matter of time, until the film will be done..."
- 85. That was not everything yet. Another, this time a quite personal, highlight was standing on the program: I was allowed to play with in a production! And that happened this way: In front of the CINEMAGIC entrance, always in the Universal Studios, was standing a huge crowd of people around a speaker and I was finding my path through to be part of them. What the animator had said until then was not to my knowledge, because I just arrived at the trick studio entrance. Only his last words were finding their way into my ears: "We are looking for a courageous volunteer, between 18 years old and 50 young, neither below 30 kilos of weight heavy nor above 100 kilos light."

- 86. Well I was thinking to myself during entering the dark studio set, if nobody will reply to this enquiry, it's my turn. They will not risk a headline in the next Los Angeles Times: "Stupid German killed during an Universal stunt", therefore I wanted to play with in this game. That's the way it was, there were no real volunteers. Only "encouraged" fathers, who were pointing with their fingers onto their quite scared children, who did not really want to play with. They did not really want to be part of it! Typical TV-children who are looking what the others do, instead of letting out their own action pig by doing really something.
- 87. Or, it's possible that they have been too young for it. They had not yet reached the required 18 years, because before that you are not allowed to sign the paper, which was waiting for myself behind the stage of this location, the exclusion of liability of the members of the Universal Studio Team, if something really worse was happening to myself. There is climbing up your blood pressure, if you are signing something like this. But I knew this situation from my very first car race in year 1976 at the International Motor Racing School of Jim Russell's at Snetterton-Norwich in *Merry Old England*.
- 88. Anyway, my pulse was upcoming into the limits of the *Beta-blocker pills* area. I felt queasy, because I absolutely did not know what was waiting for myself. Only the power of experience of the last decades was winning against my punctual fear of this moment. I signed a bit itchy...
- 89. Before I was allowed to sign the papers, I was asked to introduce myself on stage in front of the audience. Because I had to lift my aluminium suitcases with the content of a total weight of eight kilograms including the quite heavy screenplays and the fact that I was bearing my camera on my belly, the moderator introduced myself as a professional photographer. This I really am somehow, therefore I made no contradiction. Then he asked me for my land of origin, which I replied with: "Germany!" He countered this with "Schnaps". I replied "Milk" with a gentle smile. He was bending himself with a loud laughing and the audience applauded, nevertheless the fact that I was not quite sure, whether they understood what he meant, talking about "Schnaps"... Americans and foreign languages... That is a theme with some unknown elements... Why should it be different? The whole wide world is communicating in English! How is trying to communicate a Chinese person with a German in Paris-France? In English, of course! Or better in Russian language? "Ja tebja ljublju" means "I love you!" And "Krassnaja schenchina" every man calls "a pretty woman". Applause, applause, but is this enough for an intense conversation?
- 90. After this short introduction intermezzo I was standing behind the scenes in Universal land and was waiting for my first big stage appearance. I was allowed to drink some water. Before it was my turn, I tried to find out by getting some answers of my coach, guess who he was, yes you are right, he was a Chinese person with whom I was speaking yes, you are right again English, what was exactly awaiting to myself outside on stage.
- 91. The Chinese informed me about a three minutes long *action* higher up on stage. But there would not be any real danger for myself, because I was safely fixed on a rope around my body. I was thinking whether I was able to hang above the stage fixed on a

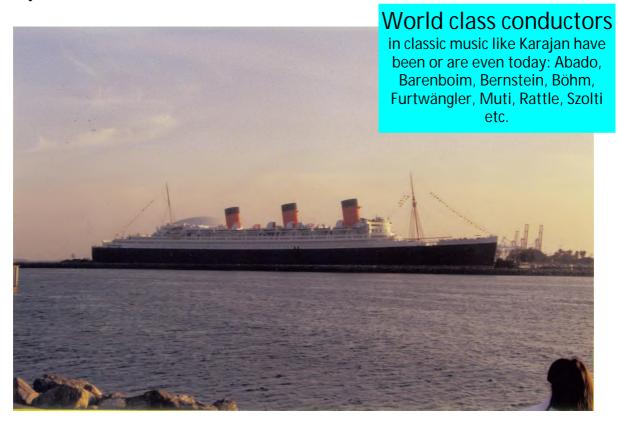
belly belt and came to the conclusion that it should be better three minutes long, then four minutes. Well then, let's do the *action* now...

- 92. I was marching my way behind the walking Chinese in front of myself. We climbed up a small leader to come to a little door in backstage. Behind the door would be a turning ramp, on which I had to play the genius of a Professor, played by Mr. Lloyd in the famous Universal film BACK TO THE FUTURE, he said. How he was hanging on the famous clock of the church in his hometown, before he is activating the De Lorean wonder time machine landing in different and foreign ages. His partner in this tremendously successful film has been the magnificent Michael Fox.
- 93. My Chinese was asking me to enter the door. I stood in darkness above the turntable stage and was fixed by my true coach with the mentioned rope. When he had finished this he showed me two loops, through which I had to enter my hands and with which I had to control two electric contacts. In no case at all, he instructed myself I was allowed to take off my hands from these loops. Why this it was clear to myself later, I could have blessed myself heavily in case of contradiction to this rule by cutting off my arms. The super accident. (Of course my thoughts were wrong, because... carry on reading, please...)
- 94. The super accident did not take place. The moderator was turning on the spot lights onto myself and he was laughing about my wig. He said: "You are looking like a Spice girl!" This I tried to answer with "But I can't sing!" (That joke was really not necessary, because the Spice Girls have their own long hair with a perfect hair cut and the wig was rented by myself from the Universal Studios for this special action. They wanted me to look like that...) Anyway, then he asked me in German language speaking, whether I was ready for action and I answered in English, that his German was very good. He seemed to be happy about it and was screaming "action".
- 95. My Chinese coach had instructed myself to articulate wildly with my arms, after having heard his word "action". I well behaved and articulated wildly with my arms. During this action I pressed the electric contacts with my fingers. When I used them both once at the very same moment, the door was turning and I disappeared into the save backstage area. (There was no way in cutting off anything by this method, that was completely clear for now...) After this not really bloody action, but even funny test of my courage I took my place again in a spectator seat in the audience room, when I noticed what was hanging instead of myself at the clock of my hometown: a human skeleton of bones. "Better him, than myself!" I was thinking before I left this place of my first big action appearance on a stage in American film industry.
- 96. There is another thing to mention: In this hall we were instructed how film business let fall somebody down the *Statue of Freedom* at the harbour of New York. The camera is driving up on rails at a steel tube frame, during the actor laying on a rubber plate is wildly moving his arms and legs, that the spectator of the film gets the impression the actor is practising the free downfall... More than that. We got some private lessons how films will getting some kind of music and more or less noisy lutes. Anything which is creating most different sounds or even noises is in practical use. One of the *Maestros* in the philharmonic world of conducting an orchestra called Herbert von Karajan would

have been most impressed, if his orchestra would have given him such new phenomenal elements in the way of expressing feelings as part of the music.

97. That was it. My visit to the land of Universal Studios. It was a dark night now. Before I left the huge area I took a picture of an African salesman with his two sons just beside the three white coloured astronauts printed on a cardboard standing beside their original Apollo space capsule. I did send him the picture from Germany, nevertheless the fact that the camera had to make an enormous effort to get nice contrasts of their faces during the weak light of the night.

98. In the attractive streets of the Studio I got more and more often notice of some elegantly dressed couples of *girls and boys*, who maybe were invited to some studio party. Anyway I looked into an overcrowded, but beautifully equipped Hard Rock Café, which not only exposed some glancing Saxophones but a fully chromed veteran car of the fifties. Then I bought a ticket for the film THE TALENTED MISTER RIPLEY. A good *remake* of the film ONLY THE SUN WAS A WITNESS with the French Superstar Alain Delon from the fifties as well. I closed my eyes during the brutal scenes on the boat, if I remember right... But that was it then: After a short trip to the Queen Mary I felt quite tired and installed myself very happy into the wide bed... What a fantastic day at Universal Studios it has been!!!



The majestic ocean liner QUEEN MARY is laying in Long Beach harbour, close to the roundshaped hangar of the wodden Spruce Goose with eight HERCULES engines (owner, the richest man on earth in those days: THE AVIATOR Howard Hughes). – Nowadays the hangar is a film studio, in which THE TRUMAN STORY with Jim Carrey has been filmed for cinema...

The first try

Hollywood, Monday 07th February 2000



99. After a nearly dreamless quiet night I put on my knight equipment and drove the Chevy Cavalier from Long Beach into the direction of Hollywood. The Cavalier found the Sunset Boulevard without problems. Directly in front of the *White House* of Elie Samaha I parked at a dollar grave and paid a lot of coins that I was allowed to park there for some hours without being punished.

100. It was close to seven o'clock and I thought about a short breakfast. Exactly beside the FRANCHISE PICTURES offices was allocated the cosy Coffee Shop with his nicely tended garden, the desks and chairs, which all kindly invited for a stay. I felt invited and bought some newspapers, studied the latest news.

101. At the Coffee Shop owner I ordered a Darjeeling tea and two delicious *croissants* with chocolate. The newspapers were writing on front page even about the sixth win in a row of a professional golfing tournament by the black professional Superstar Tiger Woods. Who only once tried to chase the small, mostly white little balls on a Mini golf playground, not to speak about the huge areas of the fairways and 18 greens, he knows what an impressive performance this is!

102. The winner Tiger Woods mentally in front of your eyes, the nice American Pop Music in your ear (in fact after Britney Spears, Cher and Madonna the radio turned in some classics, too, like Mozart, Beethoven or Bach before I left this place) I made one of the most important orders in my life (a vegetarian sandwich). I am no Vegetarian, but in this moment, I tried out something different. Why this order was important? Because I took the opportunity to ask the owner about Elie Samaha. Whether he knew him. For sure, he knew him! Samaha was in the moment on his way to make a film with Bruce Willis. He even knew the planned title: THE WHOLE NINE YARDS. And, as if this wouldn't have been enough, Samaha just had finished the making of the film BATTLEFIELD EARTH with John Travolta!!!

103. I was very, very impressed. Elie Samaha, whose name I never had read on a cinema screen neither on an advertising sheet for a film nor in the print media and whose FRANCHISE PICTURES were like Bohemian villages for myself, whom I only took for the new producer of Sylvester Stallone, he seemed to be in business with two other Hollywood Superstars. My knees weren't trembling or something like that. But now I knew that I should have a talk soon with one of the most important personalities in the well turning momentum of a producer carousel in film industry.





104. I was very much impressed, yes, but I didn't show it. Nodded slightly with my head only to show my admiration and thanked for the very good and important information. Who knows, whether I would have gone into the Disney film THE KID, if I wouldn't have seen that it was – Bruce Willis as the main actor – with whom the spectacle had been done. More then that the film had been released for children with *Zero age* on and this age I had passed more then fifty times. But thinking about it: I would have gone into it in all cases. Because I phoned Robert Schütte, the owner of the Park Theatre at Lüdenscheid and asked him, whether THE KID would be played with Charlie Chaplin. Schütte denied. Then I was keen to know, with whom this new film had been turned... but this happened only three quarters of a year later...

105. After having read the Los Angeles Times I felt fit for the big presentation. I paid my bill, did send three prayers into heaven and made a ring on the bell at the right door on Sunset Boulevard. Nameplates of companies were not existing. But Brillstein-Grey had told me the right secret code for the door opener at the telephone. But I didn't use it, because a smiling black beauty was sitting in the telephone office quite close to the door. She opened the door and I introduced myself with my visiting card on which had been printed my name with a fax number only. She introduced her as Christel (of the post office) and smiled again. She was desolated that there didn't seem to be anybody in the offices of FRANCHISE PICTURES yet, when exactly in this moment the entrance door opened and Jonathan arrived.

106. Christel introduced us in a short manner and I opened my aluminium suitcase after a short handshake with Jonathan. I showed the quite young and a bit astonished looking film man my writing and photo cooperation in the Ferrari book of AUTO BECKER Düsseldorf, informed him about the title of my screenplay ROCKY VI – LADIES FIRST, which I had written for Sylvester Stallone and for some legal reasons I showed him my copyright confirmation of my attorney.

107. Jonathan made big eyes. He looked a bit unbelieving to be part of this situation and then he was smiling. He said, in no way I should leave this place, he would be back in a moment. Then he stormed up the stairs. During these moments in which Jonathan seemed to look after something of importance in his office, the entrance door opened again and a black haired beauty entered the place: "Hi, everybody!" – We greeted back and the beauty involved Christel into a small talk about last night. At the 'good' end of her profound explanations, she only added: "He's a killer. A real killer!!!" In this moment she turned around her eyes as if she had been bumped against a railway train. Well then, I thought to myself, in Hollywood everything seems to be different...

108. Then Jonathan came run down the stairs and was holding triumphant a black agenda above his head and said: "On Monday morning Mister Samaha unfortunately has a very important date." He really showed me who it was!!! The WARNER BROTHERS. My GOD, wild, terrific, fantastic. The WARNER BROTHERS, one of the biggest companies in film business. That there wouldn't be any date for myself on

Chapter 105: My visit card in Hollywood

Monday was quite clear, now. But I was not really worried, because Jonathan showed me the Tuesday in the agenda in the Samaha book and this day looked completely empty. The morning looked unused. No date. Totally free for a date with myself, I thought. And Jonathan did, what I had hoped. He wrote down my name with a pencil. Eleven o'clock, after I had confirmed with "... perfect!"

- 109. After that Jonathan asked me, in which Hotel I was booked for the night. And I told him that this was the "... Queen Mary in the harbour of Long Beach!" He made a movement with his hand and said that "... this place is much too far away for the rush hour in the morning. Try a hotel here close to us..." I asked for his proposals and after his very stylish information by letting roll different very well known names above his tongue, I decided to take the Hotel Regent Beverly Wilshire. Was he happy, that I had enough money and that I could afford this very valuable luxury hut or was he happy that I was now not anymore out of sight, so-too-speak?
- 110. Anyway, I confirmed my intention to move and after Jonathan had written down the telephone number and name of the Hotel he said "Good bye!" to me, being in a very good mood, as it seemed to me. I was in a good mood, too. The date for a meeting was fixed. What else could happen now? There could happen quite a lot. But this was not yet to my knowledge.
- 111. Long way of talking, which makes a short sense. I didn't got money from the electronic box of the bank. But this was not the mistake of the bank, but my own failure. I hadn't read the small lines of the contract with my new bank for not expected expenses in not expected amounts not really well stored in my brain. And there it was clearly mentioned black on white on a sheet of paper, sorry, "...not more then 300,- German Marks you are allowed to take from the cash box per day..." 'Bad luck!' I thought this time. What Jonathan will think, if I was not really having a room in the Hotel he had proposed myself to take for one night? Am I a stupid German nonsense talker or a financially down sized acrobat of words? Doesn't he have enough money on the bank account? How could I explain myself about it?
- 112. I didn't had to explain this, but that I didn't know yet. First I left the White House, after the date with Elie Samaha had been fixed, and put the six screenplays, six location books and six PPP (personal product preferences books) into the trunk of my red Chevy. During this action I received a heavy hit onto my back. It was Jonathan again who said short and dry to myself: "Manfred, you have done everything all right!!!" Naturally that made me quite happy. Who wouldn't have been pleased about it? But I hadn't yet sold the screenplay... Would I succeed? A somehow internal voice said "Yes, you will!"
- 113. Cool and easy I drove into direction of Beverly Hills, to look after the most expensive shopping mile of the Rodeo Drive, at the end of which the Hotel called Regent and-so-on was laying. I didn't know it. Was never there. But in film it was used for superb PRETTY WOMAN with Julia Roberts and Richard Gere. I found the spot on my map and the interesting search began...

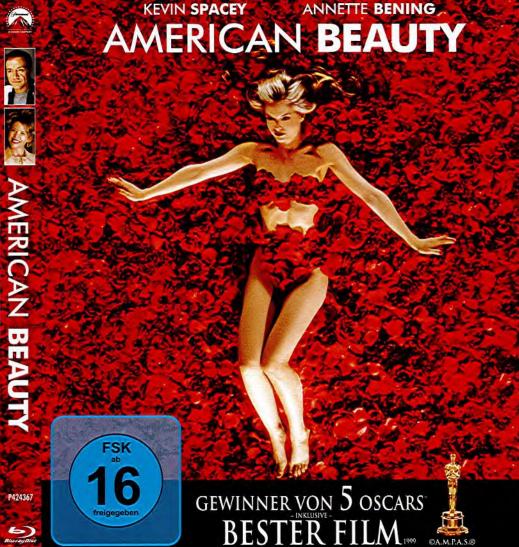

I couldn't afford the high price which has been asked to myself for the night in the Super luxury Hotel, because the cash box in the Bank of America resisted again to my intentions to get the 2.000 Marks my father had put onto my new account especially for this journey and I decided to go to Wilton, a small village beside Hollywood, where I found a good looking Motel, where I paid 64 US-dollars for bed, bath and breakfast. After the booking, I watched the film AMERICAN BEAUTY, which received an Oscar days later, a deeply moving story, but fantastically played by Charlotte Benning (the wife of the actor Warren Beatty, who is the brother of Shirley MacLane), Mena Suvari and Kevin Spacey. Who even got an OSCAR for his work. Of course, all of the other makers of this brillant film had been honoured by this award!!!

The second try

Hollywood, Tuesday 08th February 2000

115. At around eleven o'clock I parked the Chevy in front of the FRANCHISE PIC-TURES building and towed my suitcases into it. The black beauty Christel at the telephone said a friendly "Hello" to myself and after some short nice words she opened the elevator door. But I was not able to shut the door behind me. Not because my suitcases were too bulky, but the elevator was ... too old, I guess. Instead of entering the third floor, I saw myself fixed between some floors and preferred to go by FEET up into the fortress.

116. And where did I land? On the roof of the building. There was no third floor...

Who wanted to fool myself or to make a check of my nerves only? I was quite surprised. Are these the *gags* you have to live with before you are getting into serious business in Hollywood? Well then, let's go one floor down into second floor: Behind a huge door, looking like a Venetian mirror, Lisa was waiting, the main assistant of Elie Samaha. She welcomed me shortly, but quite friendly. Then she conducted myself through a long tunnel gangway with many colourful film advertising panels of the obviously own FRANCHISE PICTURES productions. At the end she turned right into a bigger office, in which a pretty blond girl was talking business at the phone.

117. Lisa has her own, very small office just behind this bigger one. The well famous front office of a Hollywood film producer. She offered me a seat in front of her desk and asked: "Rocky 6?" I nodded my head and said: "Yes!" And then I told her the story how I had gotten the producer address of FRANCHISE PIC-TURES: I had received the autograph address of Sylvester Stallone in Beverly Hills at the Wilshire boulevard by an address selling company, which made some adverts in the biggest cinema magazine in Europe, called 'CINEMA'. Then I wrote a letter to the address with a recommended postcard. On this back send red card I tried to identify the name of the Management Company. BRILLSTEIN-GREY. During the night I gave them a ring (a phone call, of course, due to the different time zones it was day then in the USA). I received the fax-number. I did send a fax to Gerry Harrington. His answering fax made it very clear, that only solicited screenplays get a chance to be officially noticed. Then there took place a phone call with Harrington, who gave me the advice to speak to Elie Samaha, the producer of 'Sly' Stallone. Again there was a midnight phone call from my side to Hollywood. At the end of the other side: Elie Samaha...

118. In a split of a second the most decisive phone call was running like a film in front of my artificial eyesight. Elie Samaha asked: "What have you written? A book or a screenplay?"

119. My answer: "A screenplay for Sylvester Stallone, because I had heard about his problems with Formula One Manager Bernie Ecclestone due to some scenes in his own screenplay about the Formula One!"

120. Elie Samaha: "This is not true. It was Ecclestone, who wanted to earn too much on the Merchandising side. Second of all he wanted to fix the winners for the film and third, he intended to decide about the actors, who had to take part in the film." (Today eight years have gone. And I must admit, that Bernie Ecclestone is a very wise man. The film DRIVEN of Stallone is maybe a technical masterpiece, but for the world of Formula One it was not the right screenplay at the right time. Maybe we shall watch a surprise as well in the upcoming future with DRIVEN, because when I saw the film for the very first time at *Liège* (Lüttich-Belgium after 27th April 2001) the film was announced in the reception area as being 156 minutes long. But my stopwatch could register 106 minutes only, for the whole film which I had seen. What about the other 50 minutes?)

121. Myself: "I understand your point of view, Mister Samaha, but I understand the point of view of Mister Ecclestone and the other teams in Formula One as well. My

screenplay will bring all these point of views into a symbiosis..."

- 122. Elie Samaha: "Sounds interesting to me..."
- 123. I added: "My screenplay not only is a book about Formula One, it's a story about the church and religion. I always liked the good attitude of Sylvester Stallone to go to a priest and asked for the help of GOD before he had to fight in the boxing ring in his ROCKY films!!!"
- 124. Elie Samaha reflected some seconds and then asked short and dry: "When do you fly to Los Angeles?"
- 125. Myself: "I've just bought a ticket for Friday the fourth of February."
- 126. Elie Samaha: "When could you visit me?"
- 127. Myself: "Monday, the seventh February, if you like!"
- 128. Elie Samha: "I like, see you on Monday then!"
- 129. Myself: "Fine, see you on Monday..."
- 130. So far, so good. So very good, so-too-speak... I definitely had spoken to the key person for the contact to the Sylvester Stallone motorsport *action film* project. And what my ears had heard was to my liking!
- 131. I looked into the beautiful eyes of Lisa and concluded: "And now here I am. Jonathan had shifted the business meeting from the seventh February on today. Please keep fingers crossed that all will become well..."
- 132. Lisa smiled and offered me something to drink. My answer: "A Coca-Cola light, please..."
- 133. In the meanwhile there was dancing a little, wiry person called Matthews through the doors and disappeared in the Samaha office. There he was instructed, how I should be handled, but this I didn't know yet...
- 134. After maybe four minutes of waiting time I was welcomed by a tall person in black clothes and a deep voice: ELIE SAMAHA. He definitely looked as impressive as most of the well known Hollywood stars.
- 135. I thanked Samaha that he gave me the chance to talk to him personally and asked, where he liked to sit. He replied, how much space I needed for presentation. I answered: "Quite a lot!" The other table behind the couch in front of his big working desk looked quite feasible to me. Samaha offered me a place at that table and we went to it.
- 136. My aluminium suitcases opened without any problem and I took out my

documents. First of all the Ferrari book, which I had written as a co-author for AUTO BECKER in Düsseldorf. Then I showed Samaha the picture of the pages 316 and 317, which I had done from my beloved (ex-) wife in front of a fantastic Ferrari.

- 137. Samara recognized the red sports car from Italy and said: "Ah, a wonderful Ferrari 250 GTO!"
- 138. I answered: "Oh, you are a true connaisseur of the make?"
- 139. The Hollywood producer, dressed in the typical artists colour black, smiled and went through the pages of the Ferrari book until he arrived on the subject 'Cars and Girls'. Samaha: "Good pictures!" My answer: "That's what Enzo Ferrari thought as well, when we presented him this book!" Samaha laughed...
- 140. Then he asked myself: "Do you know who is planning to make a Ferrari film project in Hollywood?"
- 141. Because I knew this from the always well informed racing press, I answered: "Sydney Pollack!"
- 142. Samaha added: "Well, but this project will not be realized!"
- 143. All in a sudden, Samaha closed the Ferrari book and said: "Rocky 6 is the name of your film? Then you will have a fundamental problem with Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer. MGM will not grant you the rights at the title ROCKY within 200 years!!!"
- 144. I had taken this answer into account for quite a while and offered a solution for the moment, that this business talk could be carried on: "Then you have to rip off the first chapter of my screenplay only and change the names of the artists..."
- 145. Samahas face enlightened and he said a little bit more friendly: "Interesting!"
- 146. His second objection was more difficult to handle: "I shall fly with Sly Stallone at the end of the week to the Homestead race. There we will announce our motorsport film project officially to the press people. But it will not play in the Formula One scene, it will become a film about the Champ Car series!"
- 147. I answered: "But you could take my ideas, or at least some of them and use them in your CHAMPS project..."
- 148. Samaha looked a bit amused. Then Lisa entered the room and gave me a Coca-Cola light. When I thanked her, the telephone was ringing and Samara went to his desk. He welcomed the woman at the end of the line very hearty and installed himself on his desk chair. Then he was laying down his feet onto his table in a quite common American way. After a minute I suggested a longer conversation at the phone and sat down on the couch. Lisa came into the office again and studied my screenplay and my other material laying on the other table

No to Racism - For chapter 144. it should be clear, that if I wouldn't have reacted in this way, there was no possibility of carrying on in this business conversation. Elie Samaha had to see sense in a possible use of my screenplay and this was only an option by ripping off chapter one and a change in the used names. 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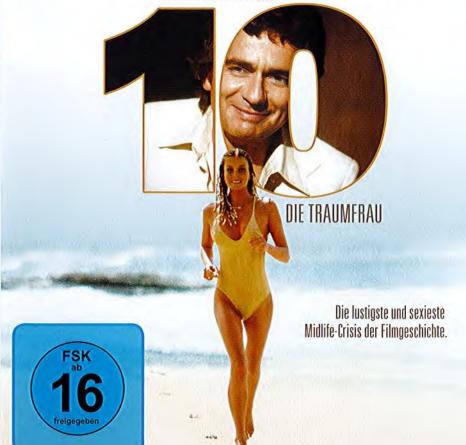

Wird das Vettels Zukunfts-Ferrari?

Ist das die Formel 1 der Zukunft?

Ferrari veröffentlichte die Studie eines neuen Boliden auf seiner Website. Der künftige "Dienstwagen" von Sebastian Vettel (bis 2017 bei Ferrari unter Vertraq)?

Auffällig: Doppelte Frontflügel, breite Reifen, kräftige Radaufhängungen und der mächtige Heckflügel:

Das Modell entstand in Abstimmung der Aerodynamik-Abteilung mit den Designern. Es soll zeigen, wie man sich bei Ferrari die Formel 1 der Zukunft vorstellt.

Hat die Ferrari-Studie eine Chance, umgesetzt zu werden?

Die Formel 1 streitet über ein neues Regelwerk ab 2016. Im Gespräch sind Boliden mit über 1000 PS (bisher rund 750 PS) und aggressiverem Aussehen. Bei einem Treffen aller Teams in Genf konnten sich die Bosse allerdings nicht auf einen Entwurf einigen.



PAR FERRARI / FERRARI'S VISION

Votre conception de la Formule 1 parfaite dépend en partie de l'histoire que vous avez nouée avec la catégorie reine. Il peut aussi bien s'agir de la Vanwall à moteur avant des années 50, de l'élégante Lotus à châssis-tubulaire des années 60, de la Ferrari trapue des années 70 ou encore des turbos si brutaux des années 80.

Fortement influencés par ce qu'ils voient sur l'écran de leurs ordinateurs, les nouveaux adeptes de la F1 prêtent nettement moins d'attention à ce qu'ils aperçoivent à la télé. Ainsi, plusieurs équipes de Formule 1 ont dessiné des conceptcar afin d'imaginer à quoi pourrait ressembler la F1 du futur. L'objectif est simple : attirer un public toujours plus jeune.

Profitant d'une réunion de la commission F1 à Genève visant à discuter des changements prochains de la discipline, Ferrari a dévoilé son projet, chose qu'aucun autre constructeur n'a encore fait. Le challenge était le suivant :

« Serait-il possible de venir avec une F1 pas uniquement à la pointe de la technologie, mais aussi une F1 au design agressif et captivante à l'œil ? Et pourrait-on le faire sans avoir à bouleverser les actuelles règles techniques ? »

« Chez Ferrari, nous pensons que oui. Laissez-nous vous présenter le design du concept qui a été conjointement élaboré par notre studio de design (Centro Stile Ferrari) et le département aérodynamique de la Scuderia. Des changements minimes ont donné à la voiture un look bien différent de celui auquel nous étions habitués jusqu'ici. Notre but était de créer quelque chose qui soit plus élégant. »

Le concept se voit paré de spectaculaires ailerons avant et arrière et d'un impressionnant carénage autour des roues arrière, octroyant à cette F1 un look de voiture de sport quelque peu sauvage. Alors que de nombreux acteurs du paddock réclament depuis plusieurs mois des monoplaces de 1000 cv ainsi que des pneus plus larges, le team principal de Ferrari, Maurizio Arrivabene, a déclaré que la présentation de ce concept était une façon de « provoquer un dialogue avec nos adversaires et d'échanger sur ce qu'il serait possible de faire. »

« Notre message était essentiellement basé sur une volonté de libérer la créativité et de créer une belle voiture. Si vous regardez les voitures des jeux vidéo, elles sont fantastiques, bien dessinées et cools. Si vous demandez à un jeune de 18 ans, il préfèrera certainement jouer pendant une heure à un jeu vidéo plutôt que de regarder un Grand Prix. »

« C'est indubitablement un de nos adversaires. Le look des monoplaces demeure très important. »



Your idea of a perfect Formula One car partially depends on your own history following the sport. It may be a frontengined Vanwall from the fifties; a neat tubular Lotus from the sixties; or a squat Ferrari from the seventies or even a brutish turbo car from eighties.

Today's newcomers to Formula One are likely to be influenced by what they see on their computer screens and not what they see on their TV screens, which is why several Formula One teams have produced drawings for a spectacular concept car, to imagine what the Formula One car of the future might look like in order to attract a younger follower.

The only manufacturer to have actually revealed their car is Ferrari, who presented it in February on the same day that an F1 Commission met in Geneva to discuss changes to the sport. The challenge was as follows:

"Would it be possible to come up with an F1 car which is not only technologically advanced, but also captivating to the eye and aggressive-looking? And could this be made without having to overturn the current technical rules?

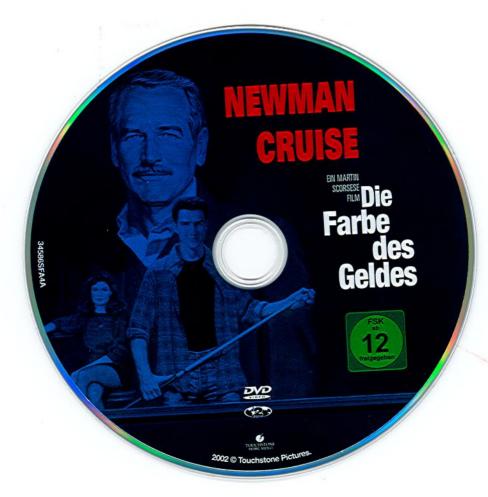
"At Ferrari, we believe so. Let us introduce you to the concept design that was conceived by our design studio (Centro Stile Ferrari) together with the Scuderia's aero department. Minimal changes give the car a look that is way different from what we have been familiar with so far. Our challenge was to create something that was – to put it briefly – better looking."

Of course, it incorporates spectacular front and rear wings, fairings over the rear wheels and makes it almost look like a slightly wild sports car. There have been calls for 1000bhp cars plus wider wheels. Ferrari team principal Maurizio Arrivabene says that revealing their concept car was to provoke their rivals into dialogue and discussion as to what could be possible.

"Our message was mainly to try and liberate the creativity and create a beautiful car. If you look at cars on video games, they look fantastic, well designed and cool. If you are asking guys who are 18 years old, most probably he prefers to play on a video game for one hour than to watch the GP.

«This is one of our competitors. The look of the car is very, very important.»

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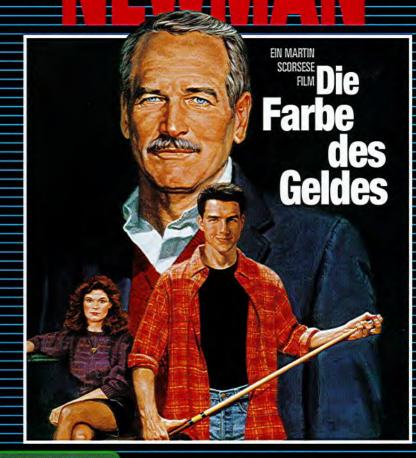
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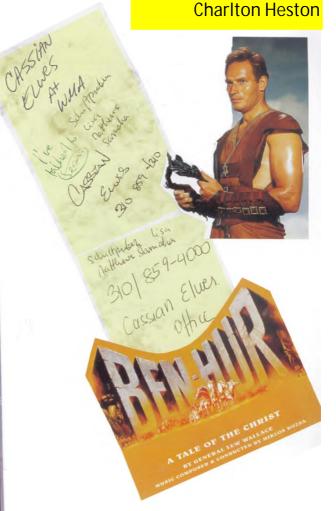

If somebody would have predicted her the mutation from a nearly ugly duck to a most beautiful swan and THE hydrogen peroxide hair blonde, who would make a marvellous carrier as the cult figure of the world of film, he or she who predicted this might have been declared to be crazy. 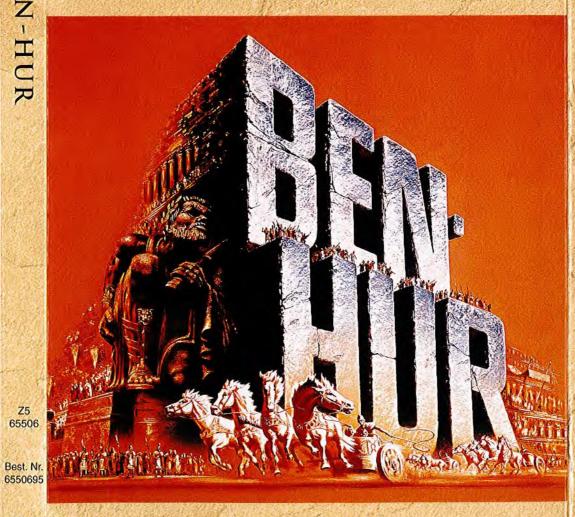

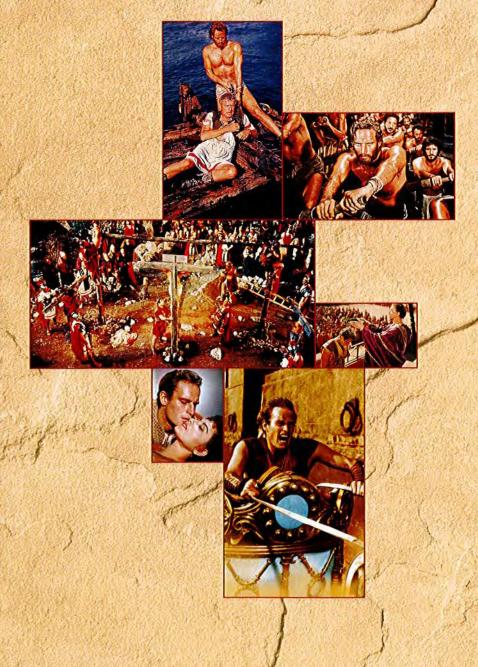

I walked through the long gangway with all the film posters inviting to see the work done by FRANCHISE PICTURES. The poster of THE WHOLE NINE YARDS was among them. A quite fantastic crime comedy with Bruce Willis, which should enter the cinemas in the mid of year 2000.

174. Before leaving FRANCHISE PICTURES I thanked Christel sitting at her phone at the heartiest, because it was her who had introduced myself to Jonathan. And said to her: "I hope to see you gain!" Christel answered with "See you!" when I went through the door to Sunset Boulevard.

175. My thoughts were flying through my head like bullets in some films. They looked like: "Now I drive to the Hotel Regent Beverly Wilshire and try to get a date with WILLIAM MORRIS from there!"

176. Or impressive and to be memorized like the words of Superstar Kirk Douglas, who was defining the principle of the film industry in a German documentation for his 82. birthday in year 2001: "Fake it and then make it!!!... When I heard this first, I hoped it was only an ironic joke. And today I am sure, it was one, maybe in connection with my life and what really happened in year 1988...

177. The Chevrolet Cavalier brought a quite satisfied passenger into the direction of the Hotel. But I didn't won yet. That was for sure. Because it was a very difficult enterprise. Exciting and with unsure destiny. A nice adventure, and sometimes I hoped that I had passed it successfully more soon then later... But it wasn't yet like that.

Beverly Hills, Tuesday 08th February 2000

178. I entered the patiently waiting Chevy Cavalier at the ticket machine of the Sunset Boulevard and I steered the car in a good mood into one of the most mundane (or fashionable?) villages of the world: Beverly Hills. Who resides here has made it. In the world of film, in Big Business and after all in the world of multi millionaires and multi billionaires as well. In the residential area prices have been asked for more then three millions of dollars for the villas, which were well placed behind very proud entrance roads. Magnificent villas of the stars of cinema, which could be found by name of the stars by an existing road map sold at Sunset Boulevard, for instance.

179. The busy Cavalier nearly steered himself by his own all the way down of the immensely expensive Rodeo Drive. Passing all the locations and selling points of the big names in fashion and exclusive makes with their extremely attractive offers in their windows and shops: FRED, Ballenciaga, Christian Dior, Cartier, Gucchi, Salvatore Ferragamo, United Colours of Benetton, Bang & Olufsen, Chanel, Moschino, Giorgio Beverly Hills, Ermenegildo Zegna, Valentino or whatsoever their names may be, which are all well beloved shopping targets of the fans of the makes. - Tommy Hilfiger, Ferrari sponsor of the Formula One team in the past, was very close to the Rodeo Drive and is in it maybe today as well, but in year 2000 I parked my car quite close to his very, very nice shop.

180. My target point laid exactly at the end of this expensive traffic mile of the high dollar turnovers. A huge Grand-Hotel with a mighty name and nicely looking dark red canopies with pretty laurel trees besides the shopping windows in ground floor: the Regent Beverly Wilshire Hotel. In the side roads – very close to this Hotel – my second target point for a meeting in Los Angeles was situated: the WILLIAM MORRIS AGENCY in the noble and elegant El Camino Drive.

181. After a short break at the traffic light the Cavalier used a little gap on the hurrying Wilshire Boulevard and turned right into the El Camino Drive. WILLIAM MORRIS can't be missed. Two totally glassed black giant cubes are laying on the right and left side of this super luxury way. Number 151? Right? Left? On the right side...

182. There I had to go. My heart beat went up for some strokes. A parking place was needed. But here you are not simply allowed to park. The places are numbered. Who lives here in a land house has a chance, the others have to make a research. I made a research. For a parking place. Drove again right into the parallel road to the Wilshire Boulevard and then again turned right. Now I was just behind the Regent Beverly Wilshire Hotel. And finally I found it. An empty gap in a road flanked by ticket

machines. (An empty gap is a place, where a car has enough space to be parked, a filled gap is maybe a place where a motor bike is parked sideways, room enough maybe for another motor bike, but not for a car. No way...) "I must have this gap!" and "Parking action now" were one thought realized in an instant action, which took place at the very same time.

183. Armed with the two suitcases I entered the Hotel Regent. Looking for a telephone box. Finally I hadn't yet an official meeting date with Cassian Elwes from the WM-Agency. 184. In the shop I bought a WORLD COM telephone card edited by the SPARTACUS MANAGEMENT COMPANY from Chatsworth California. Value 30 US-dollar and good for 30 minutes for talks within the USA. The serial card number was 355-4065-432. And the instructions printed on it seemed to be simple: First I had to dial the number "1-800-318-3935" and then I had to wait for further instructions by the operator. After that I had to enter my above mentioned card number. Finally I had to put in the Dial 1 plus the area code and phone number to which I wished to call (USA, Canada, Puerto Rico, Jamaica) And so on... Simple, isn't it? It should become more difficult: Not easy at all. I had to fight against nearly insurmountable difficulties. But, good luck to me, I didn't knew this yet...

188. First of all I needed some money for the night in the Hotel and crossed the Wilshire Boulevard and entered the next bank. The cashbox didn't paid me out the necessary

1.900,- German Mark. More then 300,- Mark I was not allowed to get per day.

189. Back at the reception I gave the information that I had cash card problems and asked whether it would be possible to receive a telephone call and if, yes, if they would be so kind to give me the information when it came in. If somebody was ringing for me. Of course nobody rang for me. Instead of this I did spend ten or twenty dollars into the coffee cash box of the very friendly women working at the reception, as a kind of gratuity.

190. The hours of the midday meal were arriving and I was looking for a good restaurant. I thought about a place at the Rodeo Drive. Was it possible to eat here well apart from shopping exclusively? Yes, it was! I went down until the end of the Rodeo Drive until the pedestrian area and arrived at a cosy little – maybe a little bit hidden – restaurant. The elegant waitress, who might have played in any Hollywood film a very good part, directed me to a fine little table. She took away knife and fork of the second cover. I choose a vegetarian salad meal with *Champignons* from the marvellous looking menu card. The meal was delicious and I thanked for it with a special extra tip apart the not to high invoice amount payment I had to do.

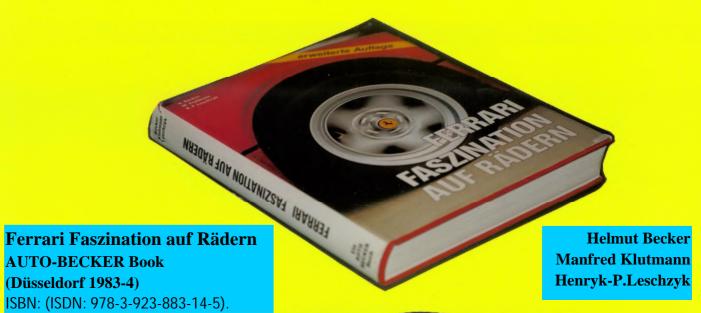
191. At my car again I took three of the six screenplays out of my suitcase and ripped off the *pages 115 until 118* of the second issue. I didn't want to make somebody unhappy forever, who had tried once to make me unhappy forever. Everybody makes a mistake sometimes.

192. In school we said on the blackboard, "...rip it off with a sponge."

193. In Regent Hotel I tried the phone again. But, surprise, surprise, my telephone card was empty!!! The computer voice of the operator repeated it several times, until I really believed it, I had phoned for 30 dollars. Because I had talked with it for three minutes only with WILLIAM MORRIS I was quite unhappy about the loss of 27 minutes...

194. "What to do?" Zeus said in difficult life situations. I did the same: "What to do?" I left the telephone box and thought about my possibilities. I will try again, that's for sure. But what would I do, if I wouldn't get a connection again? I took my aluminium suitcases and went to the backdoor of the Hotel. There I forgot my problems of the moment and stopped in front of a glass cupboard, fascinated by the possibility to see myself in a monitor. (In fact this happened a couple of hours before in Frankfurt airport, but here it was different, no camera was to be seen...) An extremely small camera must have be hidden in a tie? But where? I pushed my finger tight onto the glass and tried to find the correct point of the focus of the camera by putting the finger on different points of the tie. Until I had found the right spot in the specimen design of the silk tie. The camera was as small as a pinhead. "My compliments, Mister Minimaker, my compliments!" I thought.

195. Then I was impressed by the surveying possibilities of the tie-camera. Even in button-eyes of teddy bears of children or other fields of surveying people or goods this mini spy of the extravagant JAMES BOND CLASS could be used. "This is the best way of observing the quality of the loving care of the rented babysitters," I thought quite

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uninvolved. But then the idea was clear in my brain: "Maybe I am surveyed as well? In this moment?" – Of course you will not always get an answer to any question you might have. Therefore I decided to try my luck again with the nearly unused telephone card. Again nothing happened to my liking. The card had no units left for a new phone call. Suddenly an interior voice said to me: "Your way of talking is computerized and registered. Change your voice. Then you will succeed."

196. Oh wonder: I succeeded !!! I did what I had heard, changed my voice completely, even with a hard Spanish accent and I said then to Sean (with my normal voice again), who was – much to my relief – immediately on the phone: "I have a little problem. My aeroplane will bring me back to Europe tomorrow at 12 o'clock. Please would you be so kind to give me a date tomorrow in the early morning or today in the afternoon!"

197. Sean cleared his throat quite meaningful and promised to talk to me again in a couple of seconds. I should hold the line. I did hold the line. I opened the black doors to the glass palace of WILLIAM MORRIS and stood in front of a round table of the telephone lady in the reception. She wrote down my enquiry and offered me a place on one of the two or three round shaped grey velvet couches in the huge lounge at the right side of the entrance. There where two Ladies looking into their screenplays. Their works? They leafed through their books: Two really pretty women in correct Jil Sander business look and I thought: "Maybe you would have better cards, if you would be a Lady, too!" But I wasn't one...

199. Exactly at five o'clock the smart telephone Lady at the reception desk announced my arrival with her headphones loudly, even it was many yards away, no problem to understand, what she said...

200. Two minutes later, a male voice said loudly: "SIR???" It was Sean who stood in the opened door of the elevator. I took my two suitcases and went to Sean. We introduced each other shortly. He pointed his fingers to my tie and asked: "...today no Coca-Cola tie?" My answer was something like: "Well, yes, today in the morning, but everybody gets his chance sometimes!" Sean carried on to ask myself: "What is in the suitcases?" Answer: "Much paper! But written papers, therefore I hope it has much more value!" Sean smiled and answered my question with the words: "I am working for film industry for two years now..." Anyway, two years more then myself I thought quite calmly...

201. Then we left the elevator in second floor, crossed a longer gangway until we reached room number 212 or something like that and entered the office of Cassian Elwes, which lays just behind Sean's 'kingdom'. Cassian Elwes stood up, we shook

- 206. Then I tried to hold him the book in front of his eyes, showing one of the most expensive sports car on earth, a red Ferrari 250 GTO, I tried to be precise: "I made this picture and this as well!" by showing him a photo which I took out of my money pocket, on which the Ferrari 250 GTO was to be seen together with my ex-partner Uscha in the same camera position.
- 207. Then I steered his attention onto the interview with Enzo Ferrari starting on page 43: "It took me more then eight years of work to get this interview!"
- 208. I precised: "I wanted to become a racing driver. Therefore I know a little something about motorsport. Unfortunately I didn't realized this dream, because my adviser Jochen Rindt World Champion of year 1970 died during Formula One practise in an accident at Monza Italy. Jochen Rindt had his own manager. His name is Bernie Ecclestone. A multi-billionaire who leads the Formula One Management successfully today. Unfortunately or obviously Sylvester Stallone had problems with him, when he wanted to make his own Formula One film. Because I worked a couple of years at Paris for a Formula One magazine, I have a lot of knowledge about the world of Formula One. My screenplay could help Sylvester Stallone to make his motorsport film. In the London office of Bernie Ecclestone his assistant Nicola said, that I should meet Kevin King at WILLIAM MORRIS: Here I am with my screenplay! It's not only a story of love, but of passion, not only motorsport…"

209. Cassian Elwes replied: "Sounds interesting. I work together with Kevin King. May I have a look into the screenplay?" I gave him one working issue of my screenplay ROCKY VI – LADIES FIRST and summed up: "Because I gave Kevin King a phone call from Europe in which he signalled to be interested in my screenplay, but didn't rang me back I got contact to Sylvester Stallone again via BRILLSTEIN-GREY and Elie Samaha from FRANCHISE PICTURES, who send me to you."



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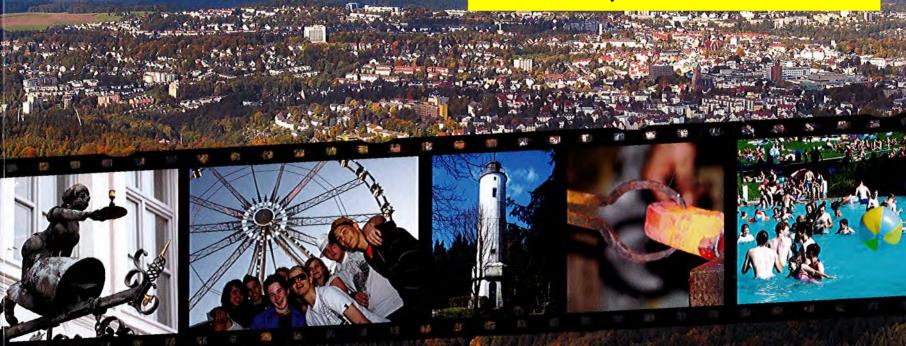

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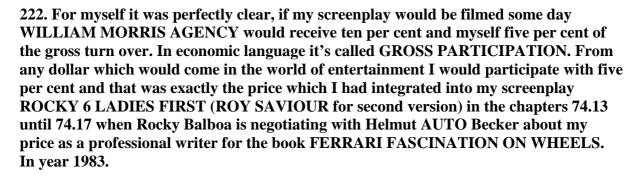
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- 210. Elwes gave me back the Ferrari book and took the numbered 177 yellow sides covered by a black back and asked: "And why should we buy it from you?"
- 211. I said the maybe most important sentence, which you may find at the end of this book, which made Cassian Elwes opening the screenplay. Then I requested him: "Please read the pages 111 and 112, then you will know it."
- 212. Elwes went through the pages until number 111 and started reading.
- 213. Cassian Elwes didn't show any reaction or emotion. Instead he impressed myself with an inscrutable *pokerface*. No movement. No gesture, no reaction, nothing at all. He only turned the page to number 112...
- 214. Then... finally. Elwes had read both pages and closed the screenplay book again. And said all in a sudden: "That's amazing!!!" He seemed to look for a most fitting word. But he didn't found it at once. He looked being moved and then confirmed with a smile: "...excellent!!!"
- 215. But then he put me on a test bench by asking: "How did you break you arm?" Intuitively I didn't tell him the truth that I broke my arm during a crash with my bicycle as a youngster at 12.6.1958, but replied: "I didn't break my arm, but dislocated my shoulder!" This reaction of mine was an incredible quick response of my brain, I didn't even think about it for a moment. My answer came well controlled and convincing in a fraction of a second only, as if the master of my brain tried to give an answer himself to protect myself.
- 216. Anyway, in German the saying goes, *I lost a stone of my heart*, as if the problems of our lives are laying heavily like stones on our souls. I had done it. The short reading rehearsal was to the liking of Cassian Elwes. If all the rest of the pages would be as close to his liking, too, then my screenplay would get the chances, from which I was dreaming. The dreams everybody is dreaming of, who has written a screenplay: TO BE FILMED.
- 217. It was perfectly clear, that my answer to his smart question about the broken arm couldn't have been to the liking of Cassian Elwes as well. He knew more about me, then I could imagined, because he asked me for confirmation about my accident in my youth. Therefore I informed him about an incredible experience, which I had three days later. Three days after the incredible experience on the pages 111 and 112. An experience which I hadn't written into the screenplay, but which is written down at the end of this book. Because I know since then that it's for sure, there EXISTS a GOD or you may it call a higher intellectual being in the spaces of our universe who is conducting ourselves somehow.
- 218. Elwes seemed to be totally astonished.
- 219. He seemed to be fascinated by this interesting subject matter. Then I tried to be more precise in expressing my biggest hopes: "My screenplay could have the title BEN

- 220. Then I asked Elwes, how much his agency would get as a payment for their work. Elwes answered: "Ten per cent of the turn over!"
- 221. I replied: "Why not 15 per cent?" Elwes: "Because American law does allow ten per cent only!" I took back my offer: "Well then, please would you be so kind to excuse my question."



- 223. I stood up and sealed our contract by firm handshake. And I thanked Elwes for the maybe twenty minutes of his life he had dedicated to myself. Then I wanted to say "Good bye for now" before I observed a big oil painting hanging at the left side on the wall of his office. In the very last moment I remembered myself to the other five screenplays in my aluminium suitcase and the PPP (the so called personal preference products or possible product placements of myself), during the reality of my lifetime, products which were integrated to the moments, were any action took place year by year. Cassian Elwes did not accept my offer for taking more then one screenplay only and said: "Because I don't want that Elie Samaha will maybe loose a screenplay, I shall take one specimen only. By the way, does he really know, what is written in the screenplay?"
- 224. I replied: "No, he has no idea about it!" Cassian Elwes nodded his head for confirmation and placed the PPP together with my screenplay onto the furniture down under the huge oil painting.
- 225. I said Good bye with words: "I will not go to anybody else and tomorrow I shall fly back to Europe!" Elwes nodded again, quite pleased, because I did not had the intention to play a game with him and other agencies.
- 226. That was it. I did it. Screenplay had been sold! My head was in a whirl. But why Sean was not bringing me back to the elevator? I don't know, but I didn't feel comfortable about it. Therefore I went down the stairs to the reception with the entrance hall and the exit door. Before this took place I passed an alley of letter boxes, which were fixed in a side path just a couple of yards away of the reception. The first letter box had the inscription: C. King. Wasn't the office of Mr. Bernie Ecclestone at London writing his name with the character "K"? Kevin King? Yes, Kevin King! But was his true name Cevin King? What do I have to think about it, I thought. I didn't know. But when I saw the DISNEY film THE KID with Bruce Willis in year 2000, in

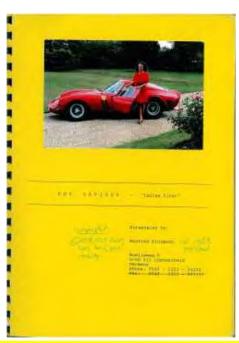




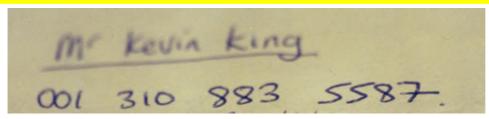

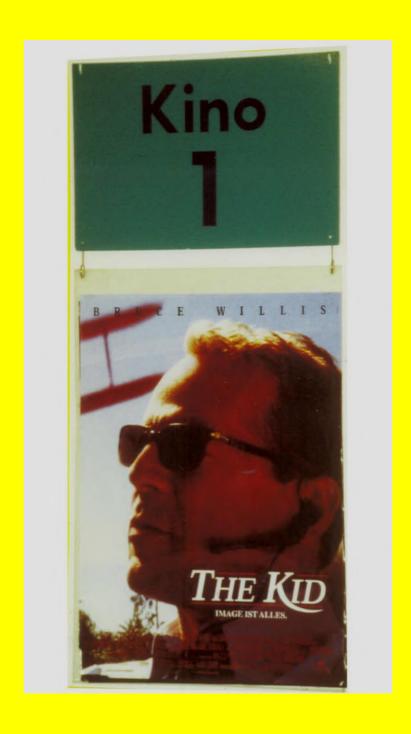

- 237. At the Pacific Ocean I was observing the panorama of the tremendous strand area, the proud silhouettes of the high palm trees and the sporty activities of the sun hungry early risers. The Chevy turned into the South, direction of L.A. airport.
- 238. There was waiting the Boeing 747 Jumbo flight number 457 at the Terminal 77. Officially we were booked for Terminal 76. But after a delay of maybe thirty minutes, we were directed to number 77, by the way. But before we were allowed to check in our luggage I had to say "...Bye Bye" to my trusty Chevy Cavalier.
